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Larry Isom: What do I remember about 9/11? It began as a day just like any other day at work at the trucking company where I worked then, until it wasn't, when someone yelled out, "the Twin Towers have been hit." The TV was on in one of the offices. I jumped and went to the doorway and couldn't believe my eyes. I could set the outline of a plane where it hit one of the towers and while I watched in horror as a second plane, "I was actually watching it happen" a second plane hit the other tower. And then the most horrible scene unfolded as we watched the buildings crumble and you could see people jumping out of the building to their

death below rather than be burned alive. It was mind boggling devastatingly to see. We couldn't imagine what was happening inside the towers. Then we saw the video where people in the streets were running away from the devastation and billowing smoke was following chasing as they ran.

There was no news yet as to who was responsible or why. At first is was thought that the first plane was out of control and hit one of the towers, but then when the second plane hit, you just knew it was an act of war against the United States of America. And before you could even comprehend all of this, a plane hit the Pentagon. Oh My God, what was going to happen next. Was it going to be our Capital Building in Washington DC or the White House, or what.

Later, we heard about the plane that went down in Pennsylvania and the heroics of some passengers who attacked the hijackers and saved that plane from hitting one of our buildings in DC. I'll never forget the story about the man on the Pennsylvania plane, telling others who joined him. "LETS ROLL" he said, as they went for the Hijackers. All those aboard were killed.

It was a memory like the day the Challenger Space Ship exploded before our eyes as we watched on TV with Krista McAuliffe, a school teacher among the killed astronauts.

God Bless and thank all the First Responders that day who ran into the burning crumbling buildings as people were running out and God Bless all those who died that day and also years later smoke and dust inhalation.

Like Pearl Harbor Day, it was a "Day of Infamy" to quote President Franklin Roosevelt.

Dana Loy: I was visiting an old high school teacher the day it happened and I remember when we saw the tv on. We both watched someone jump out of the building. We were realizing how bad this truly was. I thought 'What was inside that building would make someone jump from a 100 story window?'



Suddenly we all know that the homeland wasn't really safe anymore. I went right to church and spent the day praying. That evening we had a service.

One thing I remember that was said – we can never win a Muslim to Jesus if we hate him. But what was birthed out of that day was a rise in patriotism like we hadn't seen since Ronald Reagan. The churches were full. It was finally a nation that had turned to God. American flags were being waved again.

At that time, I believe we realized we needed to come together as a country to be able to live in the Land of the Free and Home of the Brave.


